Background

1. Summary of the Broad Purpose of the Position

The Mental Health Clinician will work as part of a multidisciplinary mental health team to deliver focused psychological interventions for individuals with high prevalence mental health disorders such as anxiety and depression in a primary care setting.

The Clinician will be responsible for:

- Providing clinical therapeutic services (individual and group) to clients across a range of teams (Adult, adolescents, children, acute etc) within the Northern region of Adelaide (Northern Adelaide Medicare Local boundaries).
- Planning and implementing assessment and treatment services
- Program development and implementation where appropriate and necessary eg. Development, planning and implementation of a group
- Liaison and consultation with other professional employees as required
- Program evaluation
- Attendance at team meetings and external meetings

2. Reporting/Working Relationships

Reports to Mental Health Manager. Will be required to work as part of a team.

3. Statement of Key Outcomes and Activities

- Assessing and screening clients referred to the service using the appropriate tools, policies and procedures outlined in the Clinical Governance Framework, including providing information about mental health and available services;
- Working collaboratively with clients and their families to identify their mental health (and where appropriate, general health) needs;
- Coordinating client therapeutic interventions by formulating client plans in collaboration with the client, staff and external workers and agencies, including making internal and external referrals as needed;

- Determining client goals and strategies to be implemented through therapy and review same as required;
- Supporting the continuity of client care and information flow between clients, staff and external workers and agencies;
- · Providing individual and group clinical interventions;
- Participating in community engagement activities promoting the mental health and wellbeing of the community;
- Developing and maintaining relationships with external stakeholders to ensure good communication flow and clear referral pathways;
- Actively participating in supervision sessions, team and staff meetings, staff training and development;
- Complying with electronic case file management system and other organisational processes and procedures;
- Carrying out any other tasks appropriate to the classification as directed by the Manager.

4. Key Attributes and Capabilities (Key Selection Criteria)

- Ability to design and implement psychological interventions for individuals
- Ability to administer and interpret appropriate psychometric tests and outcome measurements
- Ability to work as a member of a multidisciplinary team
- Ability to undertake consultation and liaison when required
- Excellent verbal and communication skills
- Ability to work independently with minimal supervision
- Ability to perform multiple tasks and meet deadlines
- Ability to apply evidenced based psychological interventions including understanding of current theoretical concepts within mental health sciences and their application to mental health issues and problems
- Knowledge of
 - Occupational Health, Safety and Welfare Act, policies and practices
 - o Equal Opportunities Legislation, policies and practices
 - Professional Codes of Conduct and Ethics: aware of and practicing within relevant Federal and State Legislation and the relevant Professional Code of Practice, Conduct and Ethics.
- Clinical therapeutic experience in the area of mental health (new graduates are exempt from this requirement)
- Experience in a range of settings within the mental health system
- Experience with the delivery of cognitive behavioural therapy and other evidence based interventions
- A sense of humour

- Psychologists Eligible for General, Clinical or Provisional Registration with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA)

- Experience providing therapy to individuals with serious and ongoing mental illness
- Experience providing therapy to women within the Peri-natal period
- Experience providing therapy within the Palliative Care field
