Roles and Responsibilities:

This position strengthens the well being of older adults experiencing abuse through intake, assessment, case coordination and the provision of counselling and other therapeutic interventions.

Duties

- Coordinate therapeutic intake for the Senior Relationships Service at the Wagga Wagga site.
- Undertake psychosocial assessments and develop and implement case plans.
- Complete risk screening and where appropriate develop safety plans.
- Deliver counselling and other therapeutic interventions.
- Work with parties to prepare them for mediation and family conferences and participate in sessions where required.
- Provide information and assist with referral to internal and external services.
- Offer outreach services where appropriate, including home visits
- Advocate on behalf of clients to ensure that their individual needs are being met and their rights safeguarded.
- Deliver elder abuse awareness activities within the community.
- Assist with the promotion of the service.
- Complete DSS SCORE assessments and other data collection requirements.
- Assist with RACR Senior Relationships Services evaluation activities.
- Participate in supervision and professional development.
- Attend relevant internal and external meetings.

- Assist in creating a safe and healthy workplace and take reasonable care to ensure your own health and safety and the health and safety of others.
- Other duties as required.

Selection Criteria:

Essential:

- 1. An appropriate tertiary qualification in social work, psychology or social sciences.
- 2. Strong skills and experience in undertaking psychosocial assessments, case planning and implementation and providing counselling and other therapeutic interventions.
- 3. An in-depth understanding of family violence, elder abuse, ageing and ageing related issues.
- 4. Demonstrated capacity to relate well to clients and other stakeholders.
- 5. Good written and verbal communication skills.
- 6. Highly developed time management and organisational skills.
- 7. Demonstrated ability to work effectively as part of a team.
- 8. Computer literate.
- 9. Eligibility for registration with at least one of the following professional associations: Australian Psychological Society (APS), the Australian Association for Social Workers (AASW), Psychotherapy and Counselling Federation of Australia (PACFA) or Australian Counselling Association (ACA).

Desirable:

- 1. Demonstrated understanding of issues facing Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities and culturally and linguistically diverse communities.
- 2. Experience in delivering community education activities.
